Whitetail Challenge Schedule

Friday, September 30

Hunters arrive on Friday evening in time to get acquainted with their guides and visit the hunt sites. Hunters will also enjoy their first meal with their fellow hunters and guides.

Saturday, October 1

At daybreak, hunters will be in their blinds and ready to hunt. At approximately 9 a.m. as deer are bed down for the day, hunters will return to the barn where they can do some target shooting, watch football or spend time as they please.

At approximately 2 p.m. hunters will get back in the field for the evening hunt until sundown.

Sunday, October 2

Once again at daybreak, hunters will be in the fields and ready to hunt. Following the morning hunt, breakfast will be served as the weekend hunt closes.
